Greater Peoria is in [Foreign Trade Zone 114](#), a multi-modal zone serving the West Central, Central, and East Central Illinois Region.

This zone provides over two-million square feet of warehousing and distribution space available for general purpose zone usage and four sub-zone sites.

Foreign Trade Zones are secure areas under the U.S. Customs and Border Protection. Operating within these zones comes with numerous benefits such as lower duties, cost avoidance, staging and showcasing capabilities, and assembly cost savings.

River.

As the largest city on the Illinois River, Peoria and the surrounding region are at the heart of the nation's inland waterway system.

The river serves as a critical transportation link, moving goods from the Great Lakes to the Gulf of Mexico.

Air.

We are home to [General Wayne A. Downing Peoria International Airport](#), a U.S. Customs Port of Entry. We are also within a few hours drive of O'Hare and Midway International airports in Chicago and Lambert International Airport in St. Louis.

Road.
